2. Declaration of Pecuniary or Conflict of Interest

4. <u>Matters Arising from the Minutes</u>

Tritiated Deuterium

At the January 28, 2011 meeting of the SPC, DWSP Staff was directed to clarify if and how activities and circumstances related to this local threat might be added as a drinking water threat. The Technical Supervisor gave a powerpoint presentation to provide background information and outline the process by which land-use activities related to this local threat could be included as a threat. A discussion followed respecting the regulations and protocols that are currently in place. A request was made for more information.

Dead Stock

The Technical Supervisor reviewed Report 4b. On the previous direction of the Source Protection Committee to investigate the inclusion of pathogens related to dead farm animals as a contaminant of concern, the report outlined the process by which land-use activities related to the handling and disposal of dead stock could be considered a threat. A discussion followed respecting the *Nutrient Management Act* and Source Protection policy. This issue will be referred to the Agriculture & Rural Working Group for discussion before being brought back to the SPC.

The Committee recessed from 10:40 a.m. to 10:55 a.m.

Transportation Corridors

At the January 28, 2011 SPC meeting, clarification was requested with regards to Transportation Corridors as an activity that poses a threat to drinking water sources. In response to this request, the Technical Supervisor reviewed Report 4c which provided the background on threats related to transportation corridors.

Transformers

Hydrogeologist Brian Luinstra advised that he has contacted Ontario Power Generation (OPG) and Westario Power who advised that all substations no longer contain polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs). Smaller transformers may still contain PCBs but no information is available unless the transformer is tested. Transformers are being replaced with units not containing PCBs. There are PCB storage facilities near Walkerton and Rockford.

6. <u>Reports</u>

Policy Development Process

preliminary policy. This draft policy will be discussed with the Working Groups and a report presented at each SPC meeting for discussion.

Septic: Draft Policy

The Program Supervisor reviewed Report 7b and the preliminary policy drafted by the focus group. A discussion followed respecting the draft policy particulars.

The meeting recessed for lunch at 12:20 p.m. and reconvened at 1:10 p.m.

DNAPL: Draft Policy

The Program Supervisor gave a presentation on the draft policy for the handling and storage of dense non-aqueous phase liquids (DNAPL) and advised that the Planning Officials Working Group had previously reviewed the draft document. A discussion followed respecting the draft policy particulars.

Agricultural Source Material: Policy Direction

The Project Manager advised that the SPC has information from previous meetings respecting Agricultural Source Material (ASMs). A small discussion group will be formed to discuss what items are appropriate to address in the draft policy. A report on this subject will be presented at the April 29th meeting of the SPC.

Non-Agricultural Source Material: Background Information

The Communications Specialist gave a presentation respecting Non-Agricultural Source Material (NASMs) and a discussion followed respecting various items in the report.

Risk Management Officials Proposal

The Project Manager reviewed Report 7c, explaining Risk Management officials. Municipalities will be responsible for implementation of risk management planning. It is timely for municipalities to discuss the possible sharing of the RMO's responsibilities.
