## 4. <u>Matters Arising from the Minutes</u>

#### Updated/Amended Assessment Report

The Project Manager reviewed Report 4a and advised that notices that the Updated/Amended Assessment Report (UAAR) was available for review and comment were placed in fifteen area newspapers. These notices were also sent to twenty-one upper- and lower-tier municipalities, two First Nation councils and the Niagara Escarpment Commission. Notices to Walkerton landowners were delayed and those landowners will have one extra week to submit comments. All comments will be compiled for the Source Protection Committee (SPC) meeting on June 15, 2011. Changes may be made to the UAAR, after which, the documents will be forwarded to the three Source Protection Authorities and ultimately, the MOE by June 29, 2011.

#### Events-Based IPZ-3 for Tritium

The Hydrogeologist Consultant reviewed Report 4b and advised that he and the Project Manager met with Bruce Power authorities to discuss the tritium issue and agreed to share information and keep the Bruce Power designated contact informed. A representative from Bruce Power will attend a future SPC meeting to deliver a presentation outlining the existing programs for monitoring and reporting with respect to tritium.

## Ruminant Inoculation to Reduce E-coli Shedding Policy

SPC member, Dr. Dave Biesenthal, gave a presentation respecting the inoculation of farm animals to prevent the shedding of *Escherichia coli* O157:H7 (E. coli) and a discussion followed respecting its viability.

A presentation was made to the NEC group providing information about source water protection.
